




Resources

Hand in Hand: Empowering Teachers –
A training Programme to develop social

Basis of the programme are mindfulness practices, dialogue exercises, active listening exercises, exercises developing personal language, diversity-targeted exercises, group and pair work as well as individual exercises. It also features the theory sections, providing context and connecting theoretical concepts to practical exercises.

Moreover, the programme recognizes the diverse contexts of training and empowers trainers to modify explanations based on their country's specific nuances.

Hand in Hand: Empowering Teachers – Evaluation Report

HAND: Empowering Teachers Programme was tested by using a quasi-experimental design with control groups (before/after effects) in five consortium countries (Slovenia, Croatia, Sweden, Austria, Portugal), teachers (primary and lower secondary) being the direct target group. Additionally, we also included principals and school counsellors.

HAND: Empowering Teachers Guidelines for upscaling the HAND:ET Programme across the EU and other countries (not participating in the project) were developed, taking into consideration the evaluation of the HAND: Empowering Teachers system for SEDA learning of teachers (whole-school teams) and policy study conducted.

The overall goal was to model the system-level solutions for support of SEDA education across the EU.






Webinars



The focus of the webinar is on the teachers' well-being and prevention of burnout. Lecturers enriched their presentation with the theoretical and empirical viewpoints on the topics with the examples from their work as trainers in the HAND:ET program for teachers, principals and school counsellors.

Special emphasis was on the well-being of early-career teachers who are especially at risk of developing adverse outcomes in their first years of service.
